This new location provides the city and its residents with several key options to include:

February and March:

EQUIPMENT/VEHICLES



- Purchased a new truck with storage capabilities to be used by our Public Works Department for maintaining and repairing our water system.
- Purchased a Skid Steer for Public Works to replace old, nonfunctioning and unsafe equipment.

INFRASTRUCTURE

- Repayed Squaw Valley Road (\$16,985 paid by our T-SPLOST funds)
- Approved repaying of Walking Bear Road (\$26,756 to be paid by our T-SPLOST funds)
- Repayed damaged portion of Snowshoe Lane and completed culvert repair (\$16,752 paid by our T-SPLOST funds).
- Approved repaving of portions of Evergreen Road, Portion of Rescue Lane, and portion of LaBelle (\$56,968 to be paid by our T-SPLOST funds)
- Replaced second large culvert on Sky Valley Way (culvert pipe had already collapsed and was non-functional)
 (\$63,200 -funded by a Local Maintenance Improvement Grant, EEE GDOT Grant and T-SPLOST funds).

NEW CITY HALL/VISITOR CENTER/COUNCIL MEETING ROOM

The City continues to make progress towards moving into our new City Hall/Visitor Center and Council Meeting Room. Internet, phone coverage, and security systems have been installed.

Furniture and office materials will be moved on Saturday. We hope to hold our April Council Meetings in our new facility. An open house is being planned.

CODE ENFORCER/BUILDING INSPECTOR

From the Desk of Jim Pyburn, Building Inspector

As mentioned in the January 2023 edition of the Sky Valley Times, permitting activity in February also experienced an increase in activity with more and more tree cutting, remodeling and building permits issued. Additionally, two more certificates of occupancy for new homes were issued, with more to come.

One item of note, though not as crucial as obtaining a permit but very important never-the-less, is once a project is camplete, we ask that you please contact this office or City Hall to advise that the work is finished. We have a list of "incomplete" jobs, particularly those on the interior of homes that we have no way of knowing are finished without a homeowner advising us or us reaching out to schedule a final inspection.

City Hall was contacted recently requesting we come remove a permit that had been posted for quite some time. I advised the homeowner that this normally is done automatically once we know the job is complete or if the permit has expired, we will contact the homeowner to ask about the project status and if they wish to extend or renew their permit. As Sky Valley continues to grow with more and more permits being issued, we thank you for your assistance in this matter.



PUBLIC WORKS

From the Desk of Jerry Shope, Public Works Superintendent

The Public works department has been working on culvert replacement throughout the city. We have replaced one culvert on Snowshoe Lane and Labelle Circle.


The crew has also been busy with right of way maintenance such as canopy clearing, leaf vacuuming, and redefining ditches. We will continue these task throughout the next several months.

Looking into the next month, contractors will be paving Walking Bear Lane, Snowshoe Lane, and Wild Bird Lane. Please be aware of workers and Road work signs throughout these areas.

On the water side; The City was hit hard with water loss due to contractors working on the culvert replacement on Sky Valley Way. We estimated losing 40,000 Gallons of treated water. The crew will be beginning a project of water line replacement from Well House number 4 near Tahoe lane out to Sky Valley Way. We will put updates on the City Facebook page along with the city website.

Boil Water Advisories- Please be advised that Boil water advisories will be posted on the City website, City Facebook page, emailed through MailChimp, and in the affected areas. If a main line loses pressure below 20psi, the city is required to Issue a boil water advisory and take samples for testing. Please be patient as this is protocol to stay in compliance with the EPD.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

From the Desk of Vaughn Estes, Chief of Police

We are glad to see folks returning to our wonderful city.

Please make sure you use extra caution while driving in our city. Also, with the increase in rentals there is an increase in vehicles on our narrow roads. The speed limits are posted, please be observant of them. Keep in mind that from the timeshare office to past the post office is a 15 MPH zone. The Evergreen extension has been a great addition for accessing our city.

Please do NOT put cardboard in the compactor. This is our most common issue causing the compactor to stop working. Violators could be subject to a citation.

Be Bear Aware...The warm weather has brought an increase in Bear activity in our area. We have already started having "Bear issues" with garbage and birdfeeders. Keep in mind that by City Ordinance bird feeders are to be taken down from April - November. Compliance with this has drastically reduced our number of Bear incidents.

Reminder, Please be mindful of parking on the streets. Make sure Fire and Ambulances can drive past.

Dog awners; make sure your dogs are safe and controlled when in our City. We have lots of one-time renters coming in daily. Many of these bring dogs with them. This has led to an increase in dogs being let out and unsupervised and we have received complaints of unidentified dogs roaming and even attacking and critically injuring other dogs.

School Bus stops. Please be mindful that we have school bus stops in our city. The bus driver has complained about vehicles not stopping for the bus to load/unload. This has primarily been on Bald Mtn. Road near Rabun Branch and Eagle Circle areas.

Hopefully there will be another Town Watch meeting this month, pending on availability of the Chapel. (Watch for the signs posted around the Valley.)

We look forward to seeing everyone return safely.
