From the Desk of City Manager, Jason Streetman

Hello residents and visitors of Sky Valley. As I sit at my desk to write this month's edition of the Sky Valley Times- May is almost over and we are entering the halfway mark of the calendar year. As a boy, I can remember the "old timers" say how fast time flies as I get closer to becoming a old timer myself- it is so true!!! May is a wonderful month and before it comes to an end- below are key dates in May.

- May 1 is May Day. It marks the return of spring and folks celebrate by bringing in branches of forsythia, lilacs, or other flowering shrubs from their region. May Day is also "Lei Day" in Hawaii. Leis are garlands or wreaths that are often made with native Hawaiian flowers such as plumeria. Nowadays, they are given as a symbol of greeting, farewell, celebration, and as an honor and in the spirit of aloha in Hawaiian culture.
- May 5 is Cinco de Mayo ("The Fifth of May"). This day celebrates the victory of the Mexican army over
  the French army at The Battle of Puebla in 1862. Cinco de Mayo is also a great time to learn about
  Mexican history, culture, and their delicious dishes.
- May 14 is Mother's Day—In 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed a bill designating the second Sunday in May as Mother's day. An important date for sure.
- May 20 is Armed Forces Day, a day to honor all those who serve in all branches of the United States
  military and can be seen a leadup to Memorial Day later in the month.
- May 22 is National Maritime Day. Created in commemoration of the first transoceanic voyage via steamboat (completed by the U.S.S. Savannah in 1819), this holiday recognizes the efforts of the U.S. merchant marine during both war and peace.
- May 29 (2023) Memorial Day—originally called Decoration Day, Memorial Day was started as a way to
  pay tribute to those who died during the Civil War and was celebrated on May 30 of every year. In 1968,
  Congress confirmed the last Monday in May as Memorial Day, made it a Federal Holiday and it went
  into full force in 1971.

As we get into June, we are seeing more and more of our seasonal folks returning and an overall bustle of visitors who come to enjoy all that Sky Valley is.

Please remember that the summer months are the time of year that we do a lot of public works projects and with increases in our population numbers can increase the chances of needing public safety. Be safe everyone.

Finally, I want to introduce everyone to our summer intern - Ms. Yuliia Poplavska. Yuliia is originally from Ukraine and is working to enhance the City's online and media presence as well as help to bolster her marketing portfolio. ## CODE ENFORCER/BUILDING INSPECTOR

The office of Building Inspections & Code Enforcement has re-located. Our new location is in back of the former City Hall at 3444 Highway 246. We are now in the former police station office.

As a reminder, building permit applications can be obtained at the new City Hall, 3608 Highway 246 or online at: <a href="https://skyvalleyga.com/building-permits/">https://skyvalleyga.com/building-permits/</a>.

With so many new and seasonal residents not familiar with our building permit ordinance or as a a refresher for full time residents, please see below When Permits Are Required:

- BUILDINGS, MECHANICAL, PLUMBING, GAS, ELECTRICAL & ROOFING
- CONCRETE WHEN USED TO SUPPORT ANY STRUCTURE
- RETAINING WALLS OVER 48" MEASURED FROM THE BOTTOM OF THE FOOTER TO THE TOP OF THE WALL
- SWIMMING POOLS, HOT TUBS, & JACUZZIS
- FENCING OVER 6 FEET HIGH
- DEMOLITION
- RIGHT-OF-WAY ENCROACHMENT FOR ANY REASON
- CHANGE OF OCCUPANCY OF A BUILDING OR STRUCTURE
- LAND DISTURBNCE EXCEPT FOR MINOR LAND-DISTURBING ACTIVITIES SUCH AS HOME GARDENS, LANDSCAPING, REPAIRS, MAINTENANCE
- WORK, FENCES AND SIMILAR ACTIVITIES WHICH RESULT IN MINOR SOIL EROSION
- TREE CUTTING, TOPPING OR TRIMMING OVER 12 FEET HIGH OF A TREE OVER 8 INCHES IN DIAMETER
   AT 18 INCHES ABOVE THE GROUND
- SIGNS & BANNERS

## PUBLIC WORKS


From the Desk of Jerry Shope, Public Works Superintendent

The Public works department is super busy working on right of way maintenance this month. Grass cutting, canopy trimming, and redefining ditches.

We encourage the citizens to put out their trash at 8:00am on Mondays to insure your trash will be picked up. Please remember to clean all recycling and break down cardboard boxes.

Through the next month we will be paving\ patching potholes throughout the city. The crew is looking forward to seeing guests and residents of Sky Valley throughout the next couple of months, please be aware of road signs and caution lights as safety is a big deal.

On the water side we have been working on getting new construction houses tapped into our water system with new water meters and homeowner valves. As always we appreciate the patience of this community.

We are glad to see folks returning to our wonderful city.

The police department is very excited to be moving into our new facility. Once we get everything set up and operating, we will host an open house for all to come see. The new facility gets us out of the old tool room and into an actual building. This will greatly move us forward in achieving our state certification. The past few years we have made significant progress in achieving this certification.

Lieutenant Ron Baumes has just completed the State Certification Managers Course hosted by the Georgia Chiefs of Police Association. This certification will now allow Chief Estes to have some assistance in the certification process. We are very happy to have Lt. Baumes assisting in this process to advance our department.

Please make sure you use extra caution while driving with the increase in vehicles on our narrow roads. The speed limits are posted, please be observant of them. Keep in mind that from the timeshare office to past the post office is a 15 MPH zone.

Please do NOT put cardboard in the compactor. This is our most common issue causing the compactor to stop working. Violators could be subject to a citation.

While driving, be extra aware of walkers looking at the leaves and vehicles stopping in the middle of the road to take in the scenery.

Please DO NOT park in front of the traffic mirrors/stop signs or fire hydrants located throughout the city. These are necessary for safety in our city. Citations will be issued for violations.

The Police Department continues to see positive results from the Bird Feeder ordinance. Our Bears are still present in the surrounding forest, but several reports of activity in or near homes have been received. The primary attractions seem to be bird feeders and unsecured garbage.

We look forward to seeing everyone return safely.
